1. President Bev Kephart welcomed those in attendance and noted it was a small attendance possibly due to some changes in our notices. The President announced the retirement of Rich Petersen from the Board of Directors and the Clinics for personal reasons after 10 years of continuous service.

3. **CHILD OF THE MONTH** – presented by Nicole Sergent

Kimberly Bobadilla Pérez – age 4 yrs  
Mother – Ana Rosa – live Mezcala – homemaker  
Father – Juan Carlos - farmer  
Kimberly was technically born dead as she was not responding at birth. She is an only child.  
She has incomplete pulmonary development which results in problems breathing. She has had a knee issue and support with some orthopedic care.

NI is supporting her therapy at CRIT in Guadalajara 4x a week. It is anticipated by the end of 2016 she should lead a normal life.

4. Board Reports:

Communications Report by Carol Antcliffe

Brochure is currently being translated into Spanish and will be ready for October.

An Event brochure with all our events calendar is being created as a magnetic handout and should be ready by October 1.

Car/window decals are available now and will be provided at all meetings and for all donors. They are static decals that go on the inside of the window and are easily removed.

It was noted that the donor that purchased the Jeffery Straker concert at the live auction for the 2015 Gala, is hosting a private by invitation event that will benefit Ninos Incapacitados and the LCS on December 2<sup>nd</sup>.

Child of the Month articles are being created for the OJO, the website and newsletter through Barb Corol and Nicole Sergent.

Website updating is still being done by Jean Treloar but website training for others is anticipated to be organized by the end of September.

#### Treasurer's Report:

In the absence of the Treasurer, Bev Kephart presented the Treasurer's report.

The last Ninos Kermes event was in April and generated revenues of \$43,000 more than double the income in 2014. There have been no event revenues since April and consequently we are at a time of the year when expenditures at the clinics are being supported by the revenues of past events and general donations. However, we have received two significant bequests in the past few months. One from Shirley Fortin and one from Ed Levinson and as a consequence, Ninos Incapacitados is in a very strong financial position to deal with clinic expenditures until events once again begin late in the year.

July – 17 families disbursing \$35,275 pesos

August – 13 families disbursing \$26,740 pesos

Four new children were accepted during the summer.

Chapala – presented by Nicole Sergent

Note these numbers represent 2 clinics per month

May – 71 families disbursing \$92,944 pesos

June – 79 families disbursing \$112,560 pesos

July – 76 families disbursing \$80,465 pesos

August – 99 families disbursing \$119,318 pesos

## El Bachillerato No Escolarizado para Estudiantes con Discapacidad (BNEED):

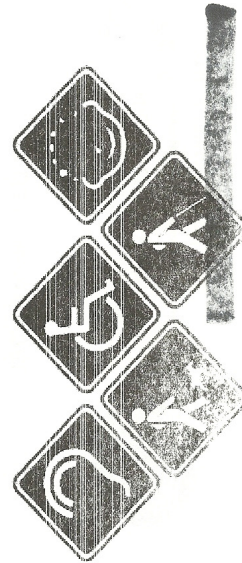
